Exchange Programs	Offered to Students of Partner Universities 1. Semester Exchange (C: Course Taking) : Spring/Fall semester, credit transfer 2. Research Exchange (R: Research Participation) : Non-credit, lab research for thesis and/or etc. 3. C + R Combined : Term may overlap and/or be continuous
Research Participation	Students are required to navigate and contact the POSTECH advising professor-to-be directly and receive official approval prior to the application process.
Maximum Period of Exchange	1. C: 1 academic year (2 semesters) 2. R: 3 months or more
Mandatory Medical Insurance	All students are required to purchase the compulsory insurance designated by POSTECH, regardless of any other pre-existing ones. <u>DB Goodinsurance</u> - ±2 weeks before/after semester (up to 7 months) - Medical expenses caused by accidents or illnesses - Loss of personal property, etc. Students will receive a payment invoice upon arrival due to POSTECH within a month of arrival. Students staying for more than 6 months, will automatically be enrolled in the <u>Korean national insurance</u> plan from their 7 th month, and will receive monthly invoices for payments. (as of March, 2021)

<p>Eligibility</p>	<p>1. Students nominated by partner universities. 2. GPA: “B” average or above (3.0/4.3) 3. English Proficiency (<u>for non-native students only</u>) : TOEFL iBT 79, IELTS (Ac) 6.0 or above, and may be substituted with documents from home university.</p>
<p>Nomination Deadline</p>	<p>Fall: ~ March 15 Spring: ~ September 15 A specific Excel format will be sent to program coordinators in the beginning of the month.</p>
<p>Online Application Deadline</p>	<p>Application Webpage Fall: ~ October 1 Spring: ~ April 1</p>
<p>Final Application Submission</p>	<p>The PDF file of the application must be sent to POSTECH by home university coordinator. Fall: ~ April 15 Spring: ~ October 15</p>

<p>Admission Announcements</p>	<p>Fall: Beginning of May Spring: Beginning of November</p> <p>Students will be receiving specific instructions and the Certificate of Admission along with other documents needed for student visa applications.</p>
<p>Welcome Packet from ISSS</p>	<p>Students will receive Important Announcements emails from ISSS regarding Housing, Insurance, Student IDs, and will also be asked to continue to liaise with the coordinators for further information on POVIS, Course Registration, Orientations, etc.</p>

Student Visa & Immigration

<p>Certificate of Admission</p>	<p>Main document for visa applications. In order for students to receive this in time, a valid passport will be needed before POSTECH applications.</p>
<p>Visa Applications</p>	<p>Credit Transfer: Exchange Student (D-2-6) Research Only: D-2-5 or D-2-8 The process is convenient than others as POSTECH is an IEQAS/Certified University. But, students are strongly recommended to contact nearest consulates and check if additional documents were to be needed.</p>
<p>Medical Check-up Requirement</p>	<p>Proof of a tuberculosis check-up (in English) is required for all students from high-risk countries* upon arrival.</p> <p>*Nepal, East Timor, Laos, Russia, Malaysia, Mongolia, Myanmar, Bangladesh, Vietnam, Sri Lanka, Uzbekistan, India, Indonesia, China, Cambodia, Kyrgyzstan, Thailand, Pakistan, Philippines, Nigeria, Republic of South Africa, Belarus, Mozambique, Moldova, Azerbaijan, Angola, Ethiopia, Ukraine, Zimbabwe, Kazakhstan, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Kenya, Papua New Guinea, Tajikistan, Peru (as of April 2020)</p>
<p>Alien Registration</p>	<p>In the first week of the semester ISSS will assist students to the Pohang Immigration Office to apply for their Alien Registration Cards (ARC), which will be the official means of identification during their stay in Korea.</p>
<p>Staying in Korea</p>	<p>All students are asked to carry their ARC and insurance cards at all times, and will be asked to return it at airport immigrations upon departure.</p> <p>Students are subject to leave the country within 30 days from the end of the semester (due to the completion of purpose of stay), regardless of their visa expiration date. If not, students will have to visit the Pohang Immigration Office for specific explanation and permission.</p>
<p>Are exchange students allowed to work?</p>	<p>On-Campus: No</p> <p>Off-campus: D-2-6 visa holders are allowed to work part time, only if with the approval from the Immigration Office. Students must first receive permission from their department, then, ISSS will assist with specific procedures. ※ <i>Tutoring and construction work is strictly prohibited.</i></p>

(Wed. ~ Fri.)</p> <p>Info on life in Korea/Pohang, course registration, alien registration, housing, transportation, mobile phone/SIM cards, bank accounts, insurance, security & health, etc.</p>
